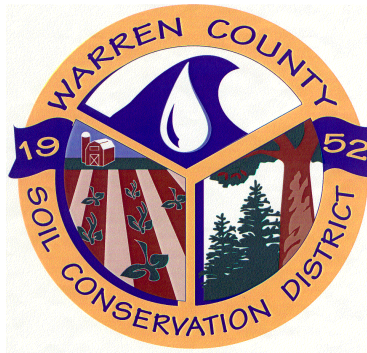

Conifers:

3 year seedlings- bundle of 25- \$25

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*)

Slow grower, best on well-drained soils.
Needles tint blue with age. Used for Christmas
trees and ornamentals.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*)

Fast growing, best on well-drained sites. Use: wind-
breaks/ ornamental/ wildlife/ Christmas trees.

Eastern White Pine (*Pinus strobus*)

All soil conditions except poorly drained. Grows
moderately fast. Uses: lumber/ windbreaks/ wild-
life habitat.

Concolor Fir (*Abies concolor*)

Requires well-drained soil. Needles two inches
long, soft bluish in color with pleasant fragrance.
Use: Christmas trees and ornamentals

Fraser Fir (*Abies fraseri*)

Shade tolerant. Thick green foliage, beautiful
shape, fragrant, retains needles well. Excellent
Christmas tree, also used for ornamentals and wa-
tershed protection.

Wildflower Seeds:

4 ounce poly-bags \$13 each.

Sunny Mix– Sun and dry conditions with a wide
spectrum of colors. 4 oz. covers 1,350 sq. ft.

Shady Mix- Does well in dappled sun or partial
shade. Covers 1,200 sq. ft.

Bird & Butterfly Mix- Attracts nectar loving birds
& insects with varieties that produce seed feeding
birds appreciate. Covers 1,350 sq. ft.

Enviro-friendly Mix- Wildflowers and flowering
herbs attract beneficial insects. Varieties that help
deter garden pests. Covers 1,350 sq. ft.

Hardwoods & Shrubs:

Bundle of 5 - \$9

Bundle of 25- \$34– oak & maple only

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*)

New Jersey's state tree! Best in sandy-rich loam soil in
full sun. Valuable for timber and wildlife.

Sugar Maple (*Acer saccharum*)

This dual purpose tree provides excellent shade. Sap
used for maple syrup. Wood used in furniture making.

American Hazelnut (*Corylus Americana*)

Grows to 12' tall on rich, moist well drained soils. Roots
form thickets. Leaves red/orange in autumn. Attractive to
birds and wildlife for its nuts.

Arrowwood Viburnum (*Viburnum dentatum*)

Durable and easy to grow on wide range of soils & mois-
ture levels. White flowers in May– July are a source for
pollinators. Yellow/orange/ red fall foliage followed by
blue berries attractive to birds & wildlife reaches 6-10'
tall. Uses: foundation plantings, naturalizing, borders/
hedges.

Red Osier Dogwood (*Cornus stolonifera*)

Grows to 9" on wet, sunny sites and abandoned fields
with heavier soils. White flowers in May, red foliage in
fall, followed by blue berries. Uses: hedges, food and
shelter source for wildlife..

Pink Lady Winterberry (*Euonymus bungeanus*)

Large deciduous multi stemmed shrub reaching 15-25'
in height with an equal spread. Flowers small, white, incon-
spicuous, fall foliage yellow to red. The four lobed fruit is
brilliant in color with red/pink skin. Fruit remains and as
the capsules open the red skin of the seed is exposed
adding additional color to the fall & winter display, hence
the varietal name Pink Lady. Fruit provides food for
game and song birds. Uses: erosion control, windbreaks,
screen or noise barriers.
