

Arrowwood Viburnum

(*Viburnum dentatum*)

Arrowwood Viburnum is a durable and easy-to-grow plant because of its hardiness and its adaptability across a wide range of soils and moisture levels. Its dense form makes it well-suited for use in borders, hedges, or screening.

Reaching a height of 6-10 feet, other uses include foundation plantings, naturalizing, and as a specimen plant in autumn landscapes.

White flowers appear in May through July and are a food source for pollinators. The foliage turns yellow, orange or red in the fall, followed by blue berries attractive to birds and other wildlife.
